Focus Area 1 Commemorative Events Intent: Develop and implement a master operational planning, resourcing, and execution document for national, state, and

Develop a coordinated plan with America 250 and other key stakeholders for statewide commemorative celebrations of Carolina Days; 28 June 2026 through 4 July 2026

local commemorative events

Develop and publish prioritized planning for key event commemorative actions through 2033, and develop a prioritized list for recurring commemorative events that will endure beyond Commission tenure

Research, plan, resource, and execute SC Revolutionary War Fallen Heroes and Ship Martyrs Memorial Wall-Commission

Expand support to County and local groups through increased grants

Focus Area 2

Education Opportunities Intent: Develop and implement a comprehensive supporting plan for expanding and sustaining education and information opportunities on the SC Revolutionary War period and its impact to the Nation from multiple perspectives

Establish the inaugural South Carolina Scholars Advisory Board to support SC 250 and Trust activities

Develop and implement a coordinated plan with key stakeholders to provide and sustain education curriculum and products on SC and Southern Campaign

Complete the publication of Francis Marion, Lord Rawdon, Thomas Sumter, and other key ongoing research projects

Expand use of alternative media (e.g., graphic novels, video, virtual reality, etc)

Expand opportunities to engage and develop education and artistic works from perspectives of enslaved and free, women and children, indigenous, and Loyalist

Focus Area 3

Preservation Opportunities Intent: Develop and implement in collaborative partnership with key stakeholders a comprehensive, prioritized plan for acquisition, development, and interpretation of battleground and other SC Rev War sites

Develop and publish a prioritized plan coordinated with ABT, SCBPT, conservation/preservation and other key stakeholders for acquisition, development, interpretation, and sustainment of key sites, research, and artifacts

Explore opportunities for establishing and recruiting "friends" groups to support battleground preservation and maintenance at every SC site

Support expansion of Liberty Trail. additional sites, and technological enhancements including AR/VR, video, etc.

Develop and publish battleground guides for interpreted sites

Focus Area 4

Collaboration Opportunities Intent: Expand, improve, and sustain our efforts to gain & maintain synergy and lasting effects

Build and maintain a comprehensive dynamic list of resources, local commemorative and other events that populates via a subscriber news feed and a cogent navigable website

Develop and publish and coordinated public relations and marketing plan in collaboration with SCPRT and other agencies to better connect SC 250 actions, cultural and heritage preservation with economic development

Expand opportunities for supporting SC 250 Foundation, SC Rev War Trust, and local groups by engaging with Federal, State, and Corporate entities for grants and other matching resources
